A salad and dessert bar, and beverages served at 12:00 noon. The fashion show starts at **12:30 p.m.**


Fashion's from our Thrift Shop, will be featured and children in tradition Native American dress.

Stephen Ministry



We are nearing the completion of our "pilot"
Stephen Ministers training program. All who have participated have found the experience to be very rewarding. A service of commissioning will happen in September. By mid-September we hope to be matching our newly commissioned Stephen Ministers with care receivers.

Now our attention begins to turn towards people who might benefit from working for a period of time with a Stephen Minister. Stephen Ministers provide distinctively Christian care to people who are facing especially difficult life situations. Everyone faces challenges and difficulties, and we all have coping skills that help us during those times. But many of us, perhaps even all of us, at some point will face challenges that seem overwhelming. It is at this time that it would be especially beneficial to work with a Stephen Minister as a "care receiver."

The work of Stephen Ministries is confidential. The congregation will know who has been commissioned as Stephen Ministers, but it will not be made public with whom the Stephen Ministers are working. The privacy of the care receiver is respected and protected.

Finance Report

As in March and April, income in May and June exceeded expenses that were paid during those two months. However, the General Fund is still not in the black because of the deficit that carried over from January and February when we paid several large annual and quarterly bills. To date, we have paid our apportionments / conference tithe for 4 of our 7 months.

The General Fund expenses (excluding apportionments) for the two months totaled \$37,636. Total income was \$42,458. At the end of June, the General Fund was short by \$2,995, which will need to be made up as the months go by. The deficit amount is borrowed from our designated funds and will be returned as it is possible. If each individual member of our church would give an extra \$11, we could clear up this deficit at once.

As a church, we have many wonderful ministries that we are able to carry out, and many more that we carry in our hearts until we find a way to make them happen. We pray that each person associated with our church will find ways to help further God's kingdom.

Thank you to everyone who continues to contribute generously to make our ministries possible.

MUMC to host a District –wide workshop on worship.

On September 9, 2017, people from across the Central Valley District will gather here at MUMC to learn how to deepen our worship experience. The leader for the workshop is Dr. Marcia McAfee, and internationally recognized expert in this field. MUMC will be paying for a team to attend – there is no limit to the number of people who can be on our team. 2018 marks 125 years of ministry for Memorial UMC!

Can you believe it has already been 5 years since we began to plan for the 120th anniversary celebration! Guess what? It is time NOW to start planning for next year's celebration!

At the July Network meeting these ideas were discussed as things we want to do NOW to begin to prepare for the celebration next fall:

Pull together a team to plan the celebration event for next fall. Some of the planning that was done for our celebration in 2013 included:

Setting dates and locations, picking a theme and logo, getting tee-shirts printed, inviting guest preachers to join us, coordinating with various other activities on the weekend, arranging for entertainment and food. It was at this event that we also packed 120,000 meals with Stop Hunger Now!

You can see we need a *good-sized* team to make our upcoming event successful! If you are interested in serving on the team for next year's celebration talk with me or our Lay Leader, Jim Jennings.

- We will join the General Board of Discipleship's focus for the year to stop trying to "fix" the church, and focus on being disciples and making disciples. We will be using resources developed for this purpose, through a program called, "See All the People." (You can look it up online, if you are curious about it. I can assure you, you will be learning about it throughout the coming 12 months.)
- Going Outside Our Walls for the coming 13 months MUMC will be looking at taking ministry outside our facilities and even off site of the property. Let's get creative in reaching out with the Gospel to our neighborhoods and community. One aspect of "going outside" is:
- THE FLAT WESLEY'S: Modelled after the children's book "Flat Stanley," John and Charles Wesley will join our congregation in (2D splendor!) as we go out to work in our community. Throughout the year, whenever we go "outside the walls," we will take the Flat Wesley's with us, to help us remember our roots. We will snap pictures of the Wesley's at the various ministry sites, and collect the pictures to see what God has done in our community through the people of MUMC (with help from John and Charles!)

IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER: God can accomplish through us, far more abundantly than all we can ask or imagine! (Ephesians 3:20)

- ▶ PLUS: the other congregations of our Circuit will join in doing ministry with the Flat Wesley's! In the coming year+ each of the 13 congregations in the Circuit will have the opportunity to do ministry with the Wesley's for one month as they become circuit riders once again!
- AND celebrating "the world is our parish" the members of MUMC are invited to take the Flat Wesley's on vacation with them. Wouldn't it be cool, if everyone who went on vacation took time to do some work of loving service/ministry while we are far from home? Take John and Charles with you, take a picture of yourself in the midst of ministry, and send/bring the picture to the church office with a sentence telling the "who/what/why/when/where." We will make a display to share the ministry that God is accomplishing in the world through the people of MUMC.

I am really excited about the coming year! I hope you are, too. May God bless us richly as we focus on the mis-■ sion of the United Methodist Church, "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."
