EVERYTHING YOU WANTED TO KNOW ABOUT SUNDAY SCHOOL...



...but didn't know what to ask!

For Sunday School teachers, our most important job is to show and tell our kids of Jesus' love for everyone, especially them. It's good to learn the stories and characters and books of the Bible, but God wants our children to know how much they are loved, and how they can share that love with others. That seems like a really big important ministry (and it is!). Like many big and important things, God's will succeeds by working through the small things we do in love for others. Check out the following - you may discover a small way you can help in this ministry.

MUMC Sunday School today is taught through rotating the children through three stations: Music, Crafts, and Bible Story. The children are divided into teams based on their age or grade level.

Purple Team: Infants to Preschool (3 years old)

Green Team: ages 4 years old to Grade 1

Blue Team: Grades 2-3

Red Team: Grades 4-6

The teaching roles are: Station Teachers, Team Shepherds (leaders), and Helpers. Here are the basics of each role, what they do and how they do it. In any of these roles, you can serve on whatever schedule works best for you: once a month, one month or quarter at a time, or as a substitute. In any of these roles, you have a chance to show and tell God's love.

Station Teacher - The teacher of each station develops their own lesson based on our Whole People of God curriculum and in coordination with the other teachers.

Music Station Teacher: You coordinate the choice of songs with the main theme of the day's lesson from the curriculum. You can use songs from the curriculum or any other source. You can also tell or read a short story that also supports the theme. Songs are taught by repetition and participation. You can accompany the songs yourself or can use the service of another musician. You can also help lead the music for the opening and closing times.

Craft Station Teacher: You develop age appropriate crafts for each team either from the curriculum or another craft of your own choosing. You gather the appropriate craft materials from our supplies or can purchase what you need for a particular craft.

Bible Story Station Teacher: You develop an age appropriate story or learning activity for each team from the curriculum. You gather the appropriate materials from our supplies or other resources as suggested by the curriculum, i.e. show and tell items, costumes, etc.

Team Shepherds (Leaders): You are assigned to lead either the Green, Blue, or Red Team from station to station (Purple Team stays in the Nursery). You stay with your team at each station, and help the kids and the station teacher as needed with the activity. As Shepherd, you help the children learn to walk and work with each other and the Teachers. You help them learn to treat each other with respect by modeling kindness and showing care for each one.

Helper: As a Helper, you can help wherever you want to and/or are needed. For example, if you really like music or crafts, you can help at those stations.

VIM: our trip WILL include an opportunity to do some kind of service project - Volunteer In Mission (VIM) - while we are in the area. This WILL be an area in which the entire congregation will want to be involved and supportive. At this time, we do not know what it will be. We will spread the word as soon as we know.

The next meeting for those wanting to go the Holy mid-March 2015 will be after the Second Sunday lunch on February 9 - 1 pm in the library.

Special Friends

DECEMBER 2013

Special Friends met December 12, 2013, with thoughts of celebrating the birth of the Prince of Peace. Our scripture was Matthew 5:9, Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Our thought question was "Where would you like to see peace this Christmas?" The meditation was from Rick Warren's book, *The Purpose of Christmas*. The simple, unassuming birth of a peasant boy born two thousand years ago in the Middle East is astounding. Every time you check your calendar or refer to a date you are using Jesus Christ as your reference point. Because of Jesus, history is divided into BC (before Christ) and AD (anno Domini, is the year of the Lord.) Every event in history and every event on your calendar today is dated by how many days and years it has been since Jesus Christ appeared on earth. Christmas is God's gift to you.

This gift has three qualities that make it unique. First, it's the most expensive gift you'll ever receive. It's priceless. Jesus paid for it with his life. Second, it's the only gift you will receive that will last forever. Finally, it's an extremely practical gift-one you'll use every day for the rest of your life. On the first Christmas night, the angels announced the purpose for the birth of Christ. Christmas is a time for celebration! Christmas is a time for salvation! Christmas is a time for reconciliation! The entire reason for Christmas is the love of God. God loves you! God is with you! God is for you!

We were saddened by the loss of two special friends in December, Irene Smith and Roberta Coon. During the month we made 17 visits, 15 calls, and sent 24 cards or letters.

A closing thought: How did you feel opening God's Christmas gift to you this year?

JANUARY 2014

Our group met on January 9, 2014. As we begin this New Year we ask God to help us be aware of the importance of our mission reaching out to our special friends and caring for needs with compassion. Our thoughts today were on compassion. With all that's going on in our world today it is easy to feel overwhelmed by the events that surround us. How are we able to reach out in the midst of this? Joan Halifax, a medical anthropologist, says compassion is "feeling alongside the suffers affected of state and aspiring to relieve it." She distinguishes this from "empathy" where we feel the other persons' suffering inside of us and are unable to distinguish our pain from the others pain.

Jesus found the right balance between the two. The scriptures tell us about how he dealt with all the needs around him. First he took action: he touched people, listened to them, and healed them. He gave of himself whenever he could. Second; he prayed" he lived his life through a series of "holy moments". He sought God and made time for God. Third, he took time apart: he went away in a boat; he went away up a hill, leaving his disciples behind, he sought out time to be alone with God.

As we think about how we can respond to pain and the tragedies that surround us, let us hope we can remember Jesus' example, his compassion, his action and interaction, his life of prayer, and his trust in God.

Our next meeting will be February 13th at 2:00 pm.

A thought: Let us hope we can find a healthy way to live in compassion!

MUMC Finances are strong! THANK YOU!

Yet even when we are strong there are challenges we face:

Do you ever have "cash flow" problems? This can happen to everyone - even to our congregation. Making donations regularly - weekly or monthly - helps keep our ministries running smoothly.

Can you pay AHEAD? If you are in a financial position to pay quarterly "up front" this can be extra helpful! There are several months when large bills come due. Having "up front" donations can reduce any "bill juggling" when cash flow is a bit sluggish.

The Finance Team is grateful for the faithful and ongoing financial support of the entire congregation.

*Finance***A Great Year for Giving at MUMC**

In terms of finances (and many other ways), 2013 turned out to be a fantastic year for Memorial.

We raised enough to:

- ♦ Send 12 of our members and two from Sierra Grace to Haiti,
- ♦ Package over 130,000 meals for Stop Hunger and sent \$32,500 to Stop Hunger Now
- ♦ Pay all our bills,
- ♦ Sent the Annual Conference \$26,602 (apportionments and \$2,660 requested for our share of the second-mile giving
- ♦ Sent \$1,853 to the conference for special offerings such as Imagine No Malaria, One Great Hour of Sharing and Bridge to Angola.
- ♦ Gave to Haiti
- ♦ Gave to the Philippines
- ♦ Gave to Heifer Project
- ♦ Gave to CROP Walk
- ♦ Gave to tornado relief
- ♦ Gave to Marjaree Mason Center
- ♦ We donated non-cash items such as the gifts the mission team brought to Haiti, the Christmas Toy Drive and the Poverello House Warm Tree gifts
- ♦ We also gave out \$5,379 in food and other emergency assistance to our community



We are grateful to God for touching the lives and increasing the commitment of all of our members and friends who helped make this possible.

We are also grateful for funds that were set aside in previous years so that we could replace an air conditioner and upgrade the Thrift Store without holding fund drives for these and other maintenance items. In addition, some of the Haiti Funds carried over from the previous year. Accumulated Memorial Funds were used to purchase canopies for our outdoor activities, such as the 120th Celebration and the Live Nativity.

At the beginning of the year, we had \$109,817 in our various funds, the biggest part of it in the Endowment, the Improvement/Maintenance funds and the Fountain fund. During the year, we brought in \$308,898 and spent \$324,128, leaving a balance of \$94,587. This reduction in balance is due to the spending of accumulated funds such as those mentioned in the preceding paragraph.



All in all, a wonderful year.

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us."

(Hebrews 12:1 NIVUK)

As I write this column we are already past the half-way mark in January! The days are flowing by so quickly! However, before we press on into 2014, I believe we need to take a moment to look back to 2013.

Last year we celebrated 120 years of serving in love. We, as a congregation, lifted up four goals we would like to accomplish in the course of our mission and ministry for the year. Let's remember these goals to see how we did:

1) Have 120 members of the congregation engaged in new hands-on mission.

We have listed 117 names! Terrific!! I am guessing we probably missed at least 3 people in the registration process for our mega-meal-packing event, so we can be pleased that we met this goal! This is HUGE!! It represents about 40% of the membership, which is excellent! It also leaves plenty of room for growth....

2) Have 120 members invest themselves in new ways in the ongoing ministries of the congregation.

We have listed nearly 90 names. 75% of our goal. This is actually very good! While it may not have gotten as close as we had aimed, having 90 people getting more involved in the ongoing ministries of the congregation is WONDERFUL!!

3) Have 120 people from the community partner with us in hands-on ministry

This one we far exceeded our goal! We have about 200 names on the list! Yea! Something we can learn from this: when people are invited to do something that is transparently an act of selfless giving to make the world a better place, they are excited to join in! And since doing this type of work is also energizing for our congregation, it may be very beneficial to seek out these activities/ministries with greater frequency.

4) Have 120 members of the congregation involved in volunteer work in the community.

For this goal we have listed 65 names. I believe the number may be higher, as not everyone lets us know what they do as volunteers. Still, our count is about 50% of our goal. This is VERY IMPORTANT to note: our congregation keeps lifting up the desire to touch more lives right here in our community. Volunteering in the community helps this in two clear ways:

A) We are carrying the love of Jesus to where it is needed - not waiting for folks to walk through our doors. As I listen to stories from people who are volunteering in the community, I can see God at work through us!

B) Many of those who volunteer in the community have made friends with people beyond the congregation, and have brought those friends with them to events at MUMC. Volunteering in the community is a gentle way of doing evangelist outreach!

Having goals helped our congregation focus for mission and ministry in 2013. In the coming year, let us not forget what we have learned, or abandon our goals because a page turned in the calendar. Let us continue to press on, that our ministries might be ever more vibrant: a beautiful mirror of God's glorious love which is ours through Christ Jesus our Lord.
