But Luke says otherwise. Jesus warns us that true hospitality has nothing to do with a reward for our action. True hospitality is giving without the hope of being paid back. True hospitality grows out of our love for God and our desire to be Christ in the world, not out of a desire to build or protect our ego or public ímage

During September and October we sent 80 cards, wrote27 notes, made 42 phone calls and 43 visits, sharing God's love with our special friends.

Fínance

Finance Report

Our church has been doing well financially in 2012. All of our bills and most of our apportionments have been paid through October. Our General Can you BUMP up your giving? B lessing U nimaged M ade P ossible!

Fund income pays the bills for pastors, support staff and lay leadership (which was \$141,061 through October), the church facilities and parsonage (\$53,664), apportionments (\$22,479), and program and office expenses (\$16,133).

We began this year with a balance of \$3,166 in the General Fund. Through October, we brought in an additional \$204,361. The Hmong Language Fund had \$5,409 on hand and brought in another \$26,711 to help defray the expense of Pastor Thao's compensation. Bills through October totaled \$233,691. This leaves a balance of \$5,956 in the General Fund. The AST authorized setting aside \$3,972 of this for a facilities maintenance reserve. We used approximately half of the remainder toward our obligation to the conference's expenses.

We anticipate that income from the Boutique and Thrift Shop will cover most of the remaining apportionments. BUMP pledges and a few new BUMP contributions could take care of the rest. Please consider joining in the effort to pay our Apportionments in full this year. We are almost there. Your donations of \$25, \$50, \$100 or whatever you can give could make the difference.

BUMP (Blessings Unimagined Made Possible) giving though October totals \$7,713. Just another \$500 beyond current unpaid pledges will put us at \$10,000 for the year.

Fundraisers to help send a team from our church and Grace UMC to Haiti have raised \$5,863. \$2,600 of this was used to send Sara to Haiti in September so she can be one of our leaders when the rest of our team goes in March. Fundraisers so far include the Café Via Buffet, Sees Candy, Huntington Blvd. Rummage Sale, Fair Trade coffee and chocolate and several other events and sales. In early October 2012 I was blessed to attend the best, most practical workshop I have ever experienced. I was in Leawood, Kansas, at the UM Church of the Resurrection's Leadership Institute. I took a workshop on "Leading Change in the Congregation."

Here is what I learned that has blessed me every week for two months:

There are 5 steps to take when wanting to introduce change into a congregation's ministries.

1) gather as much input and as many ideas as possible.

2) develop a plan

3) test the plan - make adjustments and test those, too

4) train leadership for the ministry

5) launch the program

These steps are all important and need to be done in the order listed above. The step that seems obvious now, but I missed before is #3 - Test the plan! Brilliant!!

In the summer and fall members and friends of MUMC took surveys and had meetings to collect ideas about how to develop our Christian Education program, especially the children & youth ministries. In October and November plans have been developed.

IN JANUARY 2013 we will TEST the plan for having a Christian Education time on Sunday evenings. Here are the highlights of the plan:

We will begin with dinner at 5 pm - there will be a variety of food each week to appeal to various preferences. (Well, the first 2 weeks will be a variety of pizzas, but after that we will be having different sorts of foods - something for everyone)

We will ask for a donation of \$2 for adults and \$1 for kids, to help cover the cost of the food. At 5:45 we will go to age-appropriate classes.

**The children's program will use the model of "stations" to teach the weekly lessons.

** there will be at least 2 classes for adults - one in English and one in Hmong

We are looking for people who will help us TEST this program, beginning January 6 at 5:45. We need people of ALL ages:

We need kitchen workers We need teachers We need participants!
