WWD was established in October 2012. as an experiment in dealing with grief. The philosophy of this self-help experiment is that this is a way we can, as a group, give and receive support in our search for peace, hope and enjoyment of life.

We meet on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays at 10 a.m. in the Social Hall. We met 29 times this past year with an average attendance of 8 persons-total attendance of 240 persons.

Our meetings are designed for free exchange of personal feelings. Spending time together in understanding discussion, and aided by suggestions from more than 4 experienced mentors, we believe this will provide all attendees with support and a path to joy and hope.

We have discovered how important 'fun' is in replacing that empty feeling of despair that so often accompanies grief. A typical meeting begins with a few minutes for introductions, followed by 5 (or so) minutes of business (next meeting, interesting community activities, news, etc.,) 15 minutes of planned program and discussion. Then we adjourn for snacks, coffee, tea and a table game, Farkle, which brings out a lot of laughter and friendly competition. We try to conclude on a high note. Our door is open to all.

Closing thought: God, just as, in Christ, you made yourself vulnerable by embracing our humility, let us open our selves to the joys, the sufferings, the needs, and delights of every life. October 10th, the

scripture lesson came from Paul's letter to the Philippians 1:27:"Whatever happens, conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the Gospel of Christ." Paul feared that his friends at Philippi might live differently if no one held them accountable. He acknowledged how they had obeyed him while he was with them and then explained that it was even note important that they remain obedient in his absence.

Our next meeting will be Thursday, December 12th at 2 pm. Closing thought: Being a follower of Jesus is a full-time job. May we be strengthened when we are tempted to compromise our integrity.





September was an outstanding month financially. General Fund income was up by \$10, 000 over August. Of that, pledged contributions were \$4,000 more in September. The Thrift Store raised \$3,000 to go toward apportionments. We were able to add \$2,000 more to the Thrift Store total and write an apportionment check for \$5,000 in October. That leaves \$10,000 still due on apportionments and another \$2,600 for second mile giving which includes the programs that have funded many of the grants we have received. We are hoping that the Boutique and Thrift Store income will cover a good portion of the remainder due, but we will also need regular contributions to cover the rest.
