Haiti Trivia

January 12<sup>th</sup> marks the third anniversary since the deviating earthquake shook Haiti in 2010. As you know our congregation is busy fundraising to send a group from our church to Haiti this Spring . I am one of those planning on going too so I decided to list for you some facts about the poverty stricken country of Haiti.

Only 20 % of Haitians over 15 years of age are literate: Schools were devastated by this past earthquake. Our group will be sleeping at one of their rebuilt schools during our week in Haiti so we will get a close up view of how reconstruction is progressing in Haiti.

- → I was surprised to learn there are over 1 million internet users in Haiti! Out of a population of 9.8 million that is around 10%. That is higher than I would have thought but by comparison to the 73% in the United States it still is a small. One of the projects our group may be working on while in Haiti is helping to establish an internet café. This will help provide easier access to the internet, provide entrepreneurial opportunities, and allow a broadening of educational choices. Also it will generate income to supplement the food program at the school.
- + The BBQ was first seen by Europeans on the island of Hispaniola (of which modern day Haiti occupies a third)! I don't know what this has to do with our trip but I love to eat and BBQ-ing is a great addition to our culinary culture. I am very curious what foods we will be eating during our week stay in Haiti...

I hope this has been an informative and interesting trivia on Haiti. I am getting excited (and nervous) about our upcoming trip. I would like to thank all of those who are praying and helping with our Haitian trip.
