All-congregation Lenten Program begins February 10th

MUMC is blessed this year to have Rick Hutchinson and Darren Williams heading up a Stewardship Team! Rick and Darren have taken on this work because they both strongly believe that stewardship is about more than money - stewardship is about ALL our lifestyle choices. Ultimately, stewardship is about discipleship.

To help the congregation explore the deeper meaning of stewardship, Rick and Darren are organizing a congregation-wide program designed by Bob Crossman to help us as individuals and as a congregation grow deeper in our commitment to Jesus.

"Committed to Christ" is a 6-week program that explores various aspects of discipleship. The program encourages every person in the congregation to make a commitment to participate in a small group for one hour per week for each of the six weeks. The small groups will do prayer, Bible study and discussion on the area of focus for the week. On Sunday, the sermon will also tie into the week's emphasis. At the end of the sermon, folks are invited to complete a commitment card on that week's focus, honestly stating their level of commitment at this point of their spiritual journey.

The weekly areas of focus are:

FEB/MARCH

- *Prayer
- *Bible reading
- *Worship
- *Witness
- *Financial support of ministry
- *Service

Small group leaders are being recruited now, and sign ups to participate in small groups will start by January 27. Many small groups will meet at the church on Sunday evenings in conjunction with our new Christian Education hour. Some small groups will meet on Tuesday afternoons or Thursday mornings. The small groups begin on February 10. The program will conclude on Palm Sunday, (this will be a combined service at 10:30) as we commit ourselves to service and dedicate the team leaving from Haiti that night!

This is going to be a powerful program for the ministries of our congregation. It will reach across generations, and will include both English and Hmong language ministries! Please lift this program in your personal prayer time: that the

program is blessed to accomplish God's will for MUMC. Also prayerfully consider your participation in the program, and plan to register to be part of a weekly small group meeting.


AED - CPR training will begin at 10:00 am with American Heart Association instructors.


year. Eric Elgin will be back - the suggested topic is Update of Heart Medications.

INTER FAITH SCHOLARS' WEEKEND ISW 2013



Interfaith Scholars' Weekend - ISW 2013 The Interfaith Scholar for 2013 will be Fr. Laurence Freeman. His topic for the ISW: "The Art of Meditation: Sustaining the Compassionate Life".

Laurence Freeman is a Benedictine monk of the Congregation of Monte Oliveto and Director of The World Community for Christian Meditation. He was born in England and was educated by the Benedictines at St. Benedict's School, Ealing. After experience in the United Nations Youth Association, where he helped to establish local groups of young people interested in the work of the United Nations, and a year at the United Kingdom's mission to the UN in New York, he went to read English literature at New College, Oxford, where he studied for a master's degree.

After deciding to leave postgraduate work he entered a merchant bank and later began a career in journalism. After an extended retreat under John Main's guidance he became a monk at Ealing Abbey. During his time there he helped to form the first Christian meditation center.

In 1977 he accompanied John Main to Montreal, Canada at the invitation of the Archbishop of Montreal to establish a Benedictine community of monks and lay people dedicated to the practice and teaching of meditation. While in Montreal he studied theology at the Université de Montréal and at McGill University. He made his solemn monastic profession in October 1979 and was ordained to the priesthood in June 1980.

After John Main died in 1982, Father Laurence Freeman succeeded him as prior of the new community and began to travel widely. A global spiritual family and organization began to develop. In 1991 he participated in the establishment of the World Community for Christian Meditation during the John Main Seminar in New Harmony, Indiana. Freeman returned to England to establish the International Centre of the World Community for Christian Meditation (WCCM). That community is now present in more than 100 countries

Father Laurence Freeman is also the founder and director of the John Main Center for Meditation and Inter-religious Dialogue at Georgetown University.

Laurence Freeman is the author of many books and articles, including Light Within, Selfless Self, Web of Silence, Common Ground, Short Span of Days, Your Daily Practice and Jesus: The Teacher Within.

He has conducted peace initiatives and dialogues such as the historic "Way of Peace" with the Dalai Lama and is engaged in inter-religious dialogue with other faiths as well. He is active in encouraging the teaching of Christian meditation to children and students and in the reappropriation of the contemplative wisdom tradition in Christianity and society at large.

Our Special Friends group thought about the Hope in Advent. The scripture reading was from Psalms 131:3. "O Israel, put your hope in the Lord, both now and forevermore." Hope. Perhaps no other word better illumines the Advent story. Hope that Mary would say yes! Hope that Joseph would not reject her upon hearing the news of her pregnancy. Hope that their long journey to Bethlehem would bring no harm. Hope that the bright star overhead would bring only good. Advent would not be Advent without hope.

Sometimes life seems completely wrong. We ask why is this happening? What did we do to deserve this? Joseph must have wondered the same thing. He had been awaiting his marriage to Mary, and now he found himself betrayed by his fiancé. But Joseph was a man of grace and decided to quietly divorce Mary. We do not know how long Joseph wrestled with this decision or how long he searched for the best way to handle the situation. Probably Mary had thought saying yes to God would be a blessing and probably Joseph had dreamed of a very different future. Then God's role in all this was revealed to Joseph through a heavenly messenger. How different the story might have been if Joseph had refused to hear the truth! Romans 8:28 promises us that all things work for

Romans 8:28 promises us that all things work for good for those who love God. Often it does not seem that way. This Advent season is the perfect time to release any old hurts we may have felt and accept the gift of love and grace, peace and mercy that await us when we receive the miracle of God's greatest gift.

We shared briefly a hope each may have at Advent. We heard reports on visits and contacts with Special Friends, and made assignments for next month, when we meet Thursday, January 10, 2013, at two o'clock, in the library.

Eccause of various illnesses we did not make but 8 visits. 6 calls. sent 36 cards and wrote 4 notes.

A closing thought: when we let go of old hurts, we make more room for God's peace.

Each Volunteer In Mission team is



asked to bring with them a gift to leave behind with those they have served. Sometime the gift is a monetary donation. For Haiti the gift is often something "material." There is no manufacturing done in Haiti, so nearly everything is imported. It is often most helpful to bring items with the team. Below is a list of items our Haiti team hopes to bring a leave behind. We are asking members of the congregation to help by purchasing an item to donate. To make sure we get the correct items, sign ups for donations will be in the Narthex on Sundays, and church office throughout the week.

Here are some of the things we need:

15 air mattresses (new - twin size)

15 twin size sheet sets

15 mosquito nets

2 foot pumps to inflate air mattresses (may be Inew or gently used)

1 digital camera (may be new or used should do video & stills and be extremely user friendly)

shoes for children

unlocked ATT cell phones (the only kind that are compatible with Haitian cell companies)

any device with a solar charger (and solar chargers themselves)

Pillow cases that can be turned into simple clothing for children.

Be looking for sales in the coming weeks when these items will be less expensive.

Saturday January 12th was be the 3rd anniversary of the devastating earthquake that struck Haiti. This 7.0 quake was the second most deadly ever in the history of the world with over 316,000 people killed including UMCOR officials Rev. Sam W. Dixon Jr., the head of the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) and the Rev. Clint Rabb, head of the organization's office of mission volunteers. These two church leaders were killed after their hotel collapsed during the quake. They had only arrived at the hotel five minutes before. This quake effected over 3 million people with over 300,000 injured and 1,000,000 left homeless due to the numbers of homes and commercial structures damaged.

Please continue to pray for Haiti, UMCOR and Memorial Methodist Church's mission team to Haiti which will leave at the end of March.



Finance Report

2012 was a blessed year for our church finances. We were able to pay all our bills, including 100% of our apportionments. (See the Happy Feet video on the church Facebook page celebrating this accomplishment). We also cleared up an old conference assessment from the pastors' pension and benefit fund that we had carried for several years.

Our total income for the year in all categories was \$313,275. Total expenditures were \$310,222. This includes income and expenses to designated funds such as the Endowment Fund, the Fountain Fund and the Memorial Fund.

Income to the General Fund only, which covers our budgeted expenses, including both pastors, was \$282,381 and expenses totaled \$284,814. The deficit was covered by income carried over from the previous year.

2013 Pledge Report

As of early January, the total pledged for the general fund for 2013 was \$125,040. The total pledged for 2012, including the salary for both pastors, was \$136,388. There were 61 families that turned in estimates of giving last year. In addition, through our BUMP campaign (Blessings Unimagined Made Possible) 24 families turned in pledges for an additional \$7,410. This year, so far, we have 54 who have completed estimates of giving. We need to reach at least last year's level to meet our obligations for this year. Pledges are our biggest source of income and help us more accurately predict what we will be able to spend on salaries, facilities, apportionments and programs. ++ We are working to create an underlying understanding that everyone takes a turn leading ministry. We will be training current leaders on how to mentor others. We will continually lift up opportunities to take a turn serving. It is part of our responsibility as a congregation to be raising up leaders in ministry. When we let the same few provide leadership, switching roles, but not actually increasing the number of people who are trained for leadership, we are falling short of an important component of local congregational ministry.


++ At the end of March we will send a multi-generational team of folks to Haiti! This is our first congregation -wide effort to send an international UMVIM (United Methodist Volunteers In Mission) Team! It is very close to being a reality!

++ We are looking to send an UMVIM team to the UMCOR (United Methodist Committee On Relief) Depot in Salt Lake City to help prepare supplies to be ready to ship out as soon as disaster strikes anywhere in the world! This team will likely travel in late spring or early fall.

++ We are celebrating 120 years as a congregation! The Network Team will develop plans for marking this milestone.

++ we paid 100% of our apportionments and "askings" in 2012. We anticipate making that 2 years in a row for 2013!

And this is just the stuff we know about in January!! One thing that is certain: God provides in greater abundance than we ever anticipate! There will exciting ministry opportunities come our way in 2013 that we hadn't even thought about previously! We are going to be in AWE as we see Blessings Unimagined Made Possible in 2013!
