The Special Friends Group met April the with thoughts of Palm Sunday and Easter Events. The Scripture lesson was from Mark :-. We shared thoughts about our reactions to Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Our meditation was from the Brown Bulb Story a comparison of a lily bulb planted in darkness, then watered and placed in the warm sunshine and growing to become a beautiful lily for Easter, with Jesus' death, remaining in the darkness of the tomb and coming alive on Easter morning. Easter baskets were to be assembled at the UMW Meeting and delivered to several Special Friends for Easter. Our secretary, Becky, has made gift cards for us to share with our friends when we visit as a reminder to them, and their family, that our thoughts are with them. During this month we made phone visits. Closing thought: As we see a lovely blossom unfold into a beauty of life, so may we unfold beauty of Character in our lives.

When the Special Friend Group met May 3rd we read Romans :, "Share with God's people who are in need. Practice hospitality." The meditation came from the May-June issue of Alive Now. For the people of ancient Israel, understanding themselves as strangers and sojourners, with responsibility to Care for Vulnerable strangers in their midst, was part of what it meant to be the people of God. Jesus, who was dependent on the hospitality of others during much of his earthly sojourn, also served as a gracious host in his words and in his actions, Jesus promised that welcoming the stranger, and visiting the sick were acts of personal kindness to the son of man himself. Paul urged fellow Christians to welcome one another as Christ had welcomed them. Hospitality was a qualification for leadership in the early Christian Communities.

In reports on special friends we heard great reactions to the Easter Baskets that were delivered to our friends and to the Cards we now take on each visit. Emphases was placed on the importance of having a Card on file of each church member with information in the event of an accident-someone to reach. Do you have a card on file? If not, pleas see Becky in the office.

In May we made 19 phone Calls, sent 24 Cards and wrote 2 letters, and made 17 visits. We'd love to add mote members to our group. We will meet June 19thh at 2 o'clock. Come!

Fínance

Memorial meets the challenge to Stop Hunger Now

Members of Memorial stepped up again to meet the challenge of providing 10,000 meals to people in need around the world. Our Easter offering raised \$1,430 for the cause and members and guests donated \$833 at the meal packaging event. Adding this to the \$278 designated for Stop Hunger Now in earlier weeks, we raised a total of \$2,541, more than enough to pay the \$2,500 due for the meals we packed.

Mixed blessings for MUMC finances

The status of finances at MUMC continue be mixed. We had a fantastic year in 2013 and managed to carry over \$8,508 into this year. This helped us pay some major bills during January and February and to make our first installment on our 2014 apportionments.

March was challenging. We had several more large bills. Among them were the quarterly insurance bill for Pastor Thao (\$2,553) and \$1,063 to repair outdoor lighting. In addition, we paid our apportionments for February and March which totaled \$4,698.

The total for general fund expenses for March was \$30,118. Income was \$24,605, resulting in a deficit for the month of \$5,513. Added to our deficit of \$2,556 for February, our deficit at the end of March was \$8,069.

Expenses in April leveled off. Income was \$22,745 and expenses were \$22,815 so the deficit for the month was only \$70. However, added to the amount carried over from March, this means the total through the end of April is still a deficit of \$8,139. The deficit is covered by using funds from related designated accounts until the general fund income vs. expense balance improves.

As we approach the end of May, it is clear that we will need to find ways to increase income in order to continue to fund necessary improvements such as upgrading our obsolete computers, while keeping up with our monthly apportionments and other regular bills.

Thanks to everyone who has contributed. Your generosity makes all our ministries possible.

The United Methodist Church, as a denomination, is divided into geographic regions identified as an "Annual Conference." the annual conference region in which our congregation is located is called the California/Nevada Annual Conference. (CA/NV)

Each year in June the pastors of every local congregation within the CA/NV Annual Conference and at least one member of each congregation attend a meeting called, appropriately, the "Annual Conference Session" (ACS). Here is some of what happens at ACS:

Basic business is conducted. A budget for the next calendar year is discussed and set. Leadership is elected. Appointments (which pastor will serve where) are announced. At each step of the way, prayer is offered by different individuals.

Remembering that deeply committed Christians are:

Theologically informed, spiritually transformed, serving in the world the ACS includes many facets to bless those attending.

- There will be keynote speakers who help us grow in wisdom and understanding.
- There will be inspiring worship services and preaching.
- There are opportunities to serve, as well as, recognition of congregations who have been doing exemplary service in the name of Jesus.

There are 3 things in particular I would like to lift up about this year's ACS:

1) CA/NV Annual Conference, is joining with every Annual Conference in the denomination to try to eradicate deaths from malaria. We will receive an offering at ACS that will be passed in to "Imagine No Malaria." CA/NV has pledged to raise \$2,000,000 toward this effort by June of 2015. We are well over half-way to that goal. On June 8 we will take a special offering at MUMC which we will contribute to this worthwhile effort. 2) We collect used eye glasses which are gathered at ACS and sent to places where access to good eye care is extremely limited. If you have an extra pair of glasses in a drawer, bring it to the MUMC office and it will be carried to ACS.

3) Every year congregations that have shown inspiring dedication to the work of the gospel are recognized at a Mission Lunch. This year our very own MUMC will be one of the congregation to receive a certificate of appreciation for outstanding mission work in 2013!! Way to go MUMC!! Last year MUMC sent teams in mission to Haiti and to the UMCOR supply depot in Salt Lake City. We also packed over 132,000 meals with Stop Hunger Now, raising over \$32,500 for this effort. PLUS we paid our apportionments and askings 100%!!

I am blessed to be serving this congregation. As of this writing I believe I will be appointed once again to serve in ministry with the people of MUMC for the coming year. (Our district appointments will "fixed" on Friday, June 20. Before that time it is not "official" and subject to change.)

I encourage everyone to hold the ACS in prayer in the coming weeks. Seeking God's wisdom and guidance, we can do amazing ministries in service and praise to Jesus!
