The CROP Walk for the Hungry has been a part of the Fresno-Clovis community for over 25 years and it's almost time for this annual event again. The Walk will take place at First Congregational Church, 2131 N. Van Ness at 2:30 P.M. Walkers will walk a 1.5 mile or a 3 mile route, raising money AND raising awareness in our community about world hunger and the need right here in our own area.

Did you know that out of 2.000 CROP Walks that take place in the U.S. each year, our Fresno/Clovis Walk is in the top 100 for participation and for the amount of money raised? The program will begin with the haunting flute solo by Debussy-Syrinx. It was written in 1913 and incidental music to a play, was lost and then found by the widow of Louis Fleury, to whom the piece was dedicated.

The concert will continue with music for flute and piano with Janette and Scott. Included are the Mozart "Andante in C", the Spanish-sounding "Andalouse" by Pessard, the very French "Pan" by Donjon and Bozza's "Night on the Mountain." Pan was the mythological creature, who was supposed to be half man and half goat. He was part of the inspiration for Syrinx (after chasing Syrinx, losing her and playing the forlorn melody) and also depicted in "Pan," a rather programmatic, Romantic piece, featuring Pan outdoors amongst the birds, chattering river, wind and trees.

Bozza's "Night on the Mountain" begins with rather medieval-sounding arpeggios in the piano, has a slow, regal melody, a free cadenza and fast, witty scherzo.

Three church hymns for flute and harp will follow: "On Eagle's Wings, " "Amazing Grace" and "This is My Father's World."

The minister who wrote this beautiful hymn often said that he was going out "to look at My Father's World" on his hikes.

"The Garden of Adonis" is written for flute and harp. It contains Asian melodies that are very meditative.

The last piece is Ibert's famous "Entrac'te" for flute and harp. It may be the fastest piece ever.

Ticket suggested donation of \$25.00. 10% of the tickets donations will go to MUMC Emergency Fund. Our Network Team was thinking about ways to build our relationships with the other UMC in Fresno & Clovis area. The income on hand is being held for building maintenance. Thanks to the Thrift Store, we made a \$3,000 apportionment payment in July.

All bills due through July are paid **EXCEPT** \$3,171 of the amount due on Apportionments. This is about the amount due on Apportionments for 1.2 months. If everyone will continue to give at the current rate, AND if those who haven't already done so will "bump up" their giving by \$200 to \$400 for the year, we should be able to continue paying our bills – INCLUDING 100% of the Apportionments.
